Forklift Certification Schools Calgary - Forklift Certification is mandatory in North America. Nearly all provincial, federal and state rules require a worker evaluation of the skills needed for forklift safety before the employer signs off that the employee is certified. There are various ways to acquire forklift training for employees, including on line forklift training. Then again, employers must know that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Right forklift training must contain various areas of study, like for example theory and hands-on practice. Regulations do not require employers to have an outside organization to certify forklift drivers.

The suggested curriculum for a quality forklift certification service involves both classroom training and an on-site component. Classroom training typically features informative sessions with videos, power point presentations, models and discussions. Students typically need to write a test to check for comprehension of subject matter. Certificates of completion are issued upon successfully completing the class.

The use of the equipment evaluation requires the trainee to understand the job site dangers, pre-operational machine inspection, a pass/fail operational test and operational instruction.

Training usually comprises the following subject areas: Understanding legislations and regulations; Controls & Instrumentation; maneuvering and Steering; Engine Operation and Maintenance; Fork and Attachment Restrictions, Visibility; Rated Capacities, Stability, Inspection & Maintenance; Load Manipulation; Refueling; Hazardous Locations & Rough Terrain Operations and Pedestrians. In addition, there are training courses offered for employees who are transitioning to new job positions.
